Dear Friend,

On Passover the Jewish people were freed from more than physical subjugation and slavery. The "Time of Our Liberation" denotes a true freedom, the deliverance of the individual from all limitations and constraints.

G-d took the Jewish people out of Egypt for the purpose of giving us His Torah on Mount Sinai, thereby enabling us to observe all its commandments.

As such, a Jew attains true spiritual freedom when one lives according to the Torah. A Jew is "enslaved" when being subordinated to the presiding culture, when one is ashamed to be different. When a Jew allows him/herself to be swayed by the conventional "wisdom" it is a sign of an inner spiritual servitude. By contrast, when a Jew refuses to be influenced by the environment and persists in observing mitzvot, the Jew is free.

With that in mind, we'd like to wish you a truly liberating and joyous Passover experience this holiday.

The Seder

The night before we left Egypt, families sat together, eating matzah and bitter herbs, telling their wide-eyed children of the promise made to their forefathers and excitedly describing how it was all about to come true. And then, at midnight, the liberation began.

Today, we, their grandchildren, still gather over the same foods, telling the same stories and anticipating an even bigger liberation—from our slavery to materialism and our spiritual slumber. We call it "the Seder." Look, it worked the first time...

The Last Days Of Passover

Passover is 8 days long. The last two days of Pesach are also Yom Tov.

The seventh day of Passover commemorates the miracle of the Splitting of the Sea of Reeds, which completed the Redemption from Egypt. On the eighth day of Passover, Yizkor is recited after the Torah reading.

A Taste of the Future

The Baal Shem Tov, founder of Chassidism, instituted the custom of eating a special third meal on the last day of Passover, complete with matzah and wine. The meal is called the Feast of Moshiaich, and it is intended to deepen our awareness of the imminence of the final Redemption. On this day, it is said, one can actually feel the approach of Moshiaich.
